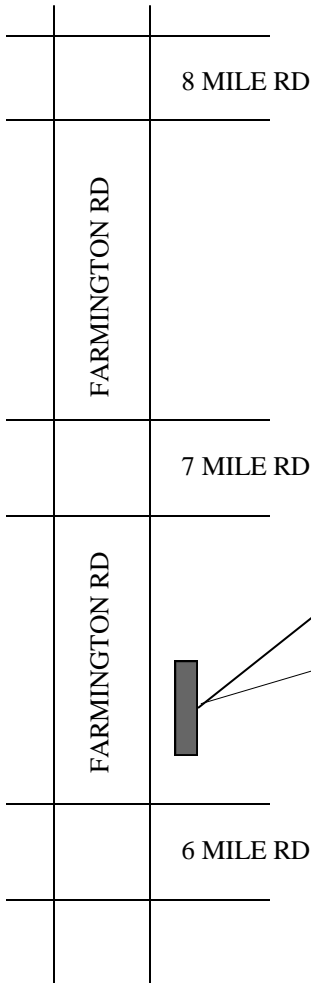

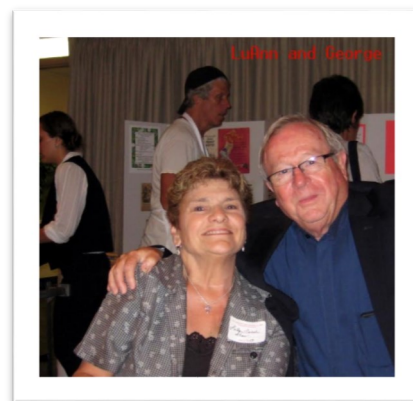

She fought cancer so hard and so bravely, just trying to make it to our 45-year reunion in 2014. Lynda had many tragedies early on in her life. Her fiancé Steven died in a traffic accident while she was driving. She would never drive a car again, because of her lifelong grief. A house fire took most of her possessions. The Class of '69 came to her rescue with dollars to help her rebuild.

Lynda was fragile in stature yet strong on courage. Diagnosed with lung cancer, she dug in for the fight of her life and faced it head on. One day Lynda was feeling down and I said what you need is a tattoo of Elvis! She said to my surprise, what time are you picking me up?

Beverly Harrison was a constant friend and comfort, every step of the way. A living testimony that angels do walk on Earth. Hilda, a former classmate, invited her to take a vacation and stay with her in Florida. That's all Lynda talked about when she came home—she had such a great time and Hilda was wonderful. Hilda would stay in touch daily by phone and email. The Leahy family opened its door and hearts to Lynda years ago. Game nights, birthdays, holidays—Lynda was a constant in our lives. Watching the life fade from her eyes was heartbreaking.

Lynda's greatest joy in life outside of her family was Elvis Presley. She would travel to Graceland every year. We spent hours talking about those trips. She would rattle off names and detailed history of anyone who was in Elvis' inner circle. The amazing part was that these people knew Lynda through email and personal meetings. She told me that at the end of every concert the announcer would say, "Elvis has left the building". Lynda may have left the building, but she will never leave our hearts. Lynda put the CLASS in classmate. It was an honor to know her and a privilege to have shared her life.

He had been shot by a North Korean sniper. At that point Bob was an outpatient and we were able to go to a Japanese restaurant. We gorged ourselves with pizza and beer. After eating Army C&K rations for many months, it doesn't get any better than that!

Also...

Nothing was ever written about the Class of '47 football team; maybe because we lost most of our games. But I still have pleasant memories. On defense **Frenchie Costella** make bone-crushing tackles, and on offense he opened holes in the opponents line so **Bob Swoish** could gain positive yardage. Bob had excellent speed and shiftiness. I can't help but think if we had a couple more players the caliber of Costella, Swoish and **Bill Lawson**, we would have done much better.

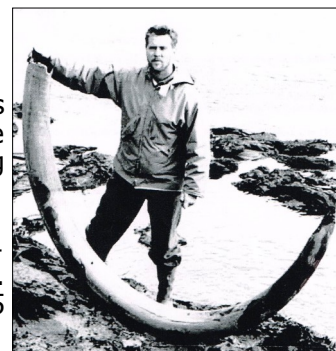
## ALBERT HARRISON, JR., SGH69; Michigan

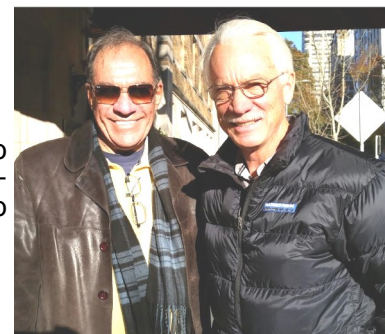
## ANNETTE (PATRELLO) QUILLAN, SGH66; Michigan

# DETROIT CATHOLIC SCHOOLS HERITAGE PROJECT

CATHOLIC SCHOOLS ALUMNI FIND HOME FOR MEMORABILIA

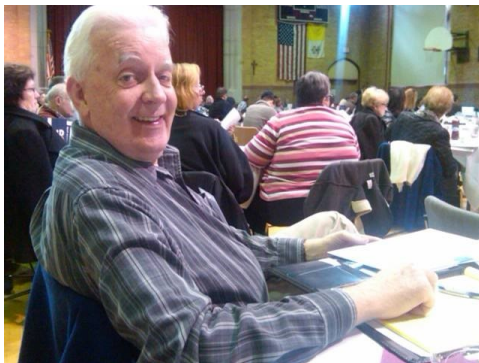
A group dedicated to preserving the legacy of Detroit's long-gone Catholic Schools has found a home for its memorabilia, on the campus of the Felician Sisters Order, in Livonia, Michigan.

The Detroit Catholic Schools Heritage Project, plans to eventually showcase the group's collection of yearbooks, letter sweaters, school mascots and photos at a building near Ladywood High School in Livonia.

Michael Butler, a Livonia attorney and Detroit Catholic Central graduate, said the group plans to create a replica classroom with artifacts from many Detroit-area Catholic schools, those that are closed as well as those that remain open. The display will include artifacts from an era when the six-county Archdiocese of Detroit boasted 360 Catholic Schools, compared with 95 now. During the baby-boomer heyday, there were 203,000 students enrolled in the 1964-65 school year. Nearly every parish had a school.

"It's to preserve the memory of everybody who built this city. They built it from nothing with nothing. They went through Depressions and World War I and World War II and through Catholic education made a better life for their kids," Butler said. "It's important to keep that memory alive."

Mike founded the project in late 2011, and its website, [www.bishopgallagher.org](http://www.bishopgallagher.org). The website's name honors Detroit Bishop Michael Gallagher, who presided over a Catholic school building boom in the 1920s, and was the namesake for a high school in Harper Woods which is now closed.



The collection includes photos chronicling major sports rivalries, and when actress Patty Duke visited a Catholic Central pep rally in 1963. There's also a photo of celebrated actor Boris Karloff visiting with Catholic Central drama students in the 1940s. Mike has received an email from a California woman who recognized her late mother in the website's photo of the St. Theresa High School Orchestra, circa 1935. Out of the blue, another donor packed up a box of memorabilia left by her late brother who died in 1957. Inside were school newspapers from CC, circa 1940s and a baseball signed by a CC graduate, Art Houtteman, who played for the Detroit Tigers in the 1945 World Series.

How old could I have been, to be already walking to school—about three quarters of a mile—and yet not be able to tell time? Scary. I lived at 15768 Petoskey, between Midland and Puritan from birth through graduation from St. Gregory's in 1955 and the University of Detroit in 1960. I remember our two phone numbers; UN 4-6825 and later UN 1-8910.

I remember Mrs. Walls Potato Chip Store on Fenkell, between Holmur and Dexter. It smelled really great. You could buy fresh, hot, salty, greasy chips at lunchtime and after school. Ah, I can still taste them.

I remember playing on the playground before it was paved and before the convent was built on it—before 1950. Remember the Sisters' homes across Holmur, next to the bicycle parking area?

And yes, I remember 8:00 a.m. Mass each day in the lower church and getting chewed out if I was late too often. Then walking in line back to the school. And later, after the upper church was built, 8:00 a.m. Mass there every day, and getting chewed out again.

I remember **Bill Greathouse**, who didn't graduate with us, when in about fifth grade being chased around the classroom by the Sister with a yardstick. Suddenly he stopped, grabbed the yardstick, broke it in half and gave it back to the Sister and said, "Ok, now we're even. Let's go." Immediately, the chase stopped.

## Boy Scout Troop 194 Alumni Complete Totem Pole Project on Mackinac Island

*"A Lasting Memorial to Scouting"* With the dedication of the new Totem Pole on September 14, 2014, Troop 194 Alumni completed their project to design, carve, paint, transport and erect a new 20-foot totem pole next to the barracks on Mackinac Island. It replaces the original pole, erected by the troop around 1952, that had deteriorated over the past 62 years. The main theme of the carvings depicts the progression of ranks which Boy Scouts must earn to achieve the rank of Eagle.

The project was totally funded from contributions not only from past Troop 194 members but also from several friends. As a memorial to the supporters, the Totem Pole contains a time capsule to be opened in 2042, the 100th anniversary of Troop 194. The project required the involvement of Troop 194 Alumni, the Boy Scouts of America National Headquarters and the Mackinac State Historic Parks Commission. 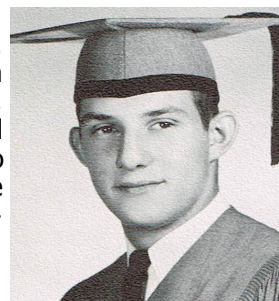

The annual business meeting was called to order by Ward Case, President at 1:50 pm. The 2013 Annual Report packet was distributed. The following items were discussed.

#### Financial Report

The 2013 Financial Statement was prepared by Peg Elwarner, Treasurer. Our income for 2013 was \$17,978.00 and our expenses were \$24,936.00. Our current bank balance is \$14,344.00. At one time we had \$30,000 in the bank, but donations have been dropping and membership has been dropping. The next two editions of the newsletter (2015) will cost a total of \$8,800.00 (corrected amount). We will no longer sell merchandise because we were not making a profit. The largest cost items in the budget were merchandise, newsletter, and postage.

#### Membership Status

The group reviewed the SGAA Membership Status report. There were 2,554 total graduates from St. Gregory. There are currently 1,804 on the mailing list, which includes family members of graduates and many non-graduates.

#### Newsletter Review

We are always looking for more family stories. It would be nice to have stories on how families came to St. Gregory Parish. Please send Ward your story. We are cutting expenses by reducing the size of the newsletter and the number of copies printed.

#### Community Outreach Activity

The SGAA Board held a meeting prior to this meeting and voted to stop making donations to local charities. It is more important to keep our organization going and the newsletter funded. We will still offer \$100 for class reunion support, along with labels and door prizes.

#### Merchandise

We have stopped selling merchandise since the sweatshirts and tee shirts are not profitable. Kathleen Connor suggested that SGAA print return address labels with the SGAA logo, and offer them for sale. No one offered to manage the project.

#### SGAA Sponsored Events for 2014 and 2015

The all-class picnic was a new event this year with about 30 attendees. Not a great turnout, but hope to keep it going if it can succeed without being subsidized by SGAA.

#### Class Reunion Plans

The Class of 1969 is holding its 45-year reunion on October 4, 2014. The Class of 1945 is holding its 70-year reunion on August 16, 2014. The Classes of 1950, 1955, 1960 and 1965 will be holding their class reunions in 2015, with the plans yet to be finalized.

### St. Gregory Spirit Awards for 2014

The Spirit Award was presented to two Alumni, both of whom are Vietnam Veterans. Dennis Leahy from the Class of 1969 received his award at the St. Gregory Night event. Bill McTaggart from the Class of 1961 died in Vietnam. His award was received by a classmate. The meeting packet provides more information on these two most worthy award winners. Everyone was asked to send nominations for future honorees to Ward Case.

### Open Discussion

Ward requested that some person or a group of volunteers take over and coordinate the major Alumni Association events; St. Gregory Night, Alumni Picnic, and the Memorial Mass. A committee is needed to continue these events. After twenty-six years, Ward is no longer able to handle these events. He is requesting this today and with no volunteers, will place the request in the next newsletter. If there are no volunteers, the events will cease this year (2014). Several alumni responded today and agreed to work on committees; Barb (Charnley) Kozlowski, David Kozlowski, Mike Morrison, Gus Torres, and Tom Bailey offered to help.

There was general discussion on how to keep the events going in the future. Ward noted that there were 175 in attendance on St. Gregory Night and 155 for the Memorial Mass. A show of hands of who had attended both functions showed that the groups for these two functions appears to be very different. Only 15-20 in the group attended both events. St. Gregory Night draws the younger classes while the Memorial Mass is more of a mixed group with more older alumni.

Ward noted that the alumni attending the events are not paying the full cost of their event. The Memorial Mass and Brunch cost \$23 for the meal, then there is the cost of the open bar, door prizes, decorations, and more. The attendees are charged just \$20, which encourages more to attend but requires a subsidy. A motion was made and seconded to raise the price of the Brunch to cover the actual cost. Motion carried.

The question was raised whether Ward would consider a lesser position on the SGAA Board. Ward indicated he would like to continue as president and to publish the newsletter, member updates, website, and email messages. Tom Bailey agreed to take charge of the committee as Reunion Chairman and organize the St. Gregory weekend events, beginning in 2015.

There was discussion on the pros and cons of holding just one day of events each year. The St. Gregory Night event has a cover charge of \$10 and we lost money by adding the hall rental, open bar, DJ, decorations, and desserts. In recent years we have had up to 500 in attendance; this year there were just 175 attendees. It was suggested that beginning in 2015, we move the Memorial Mass to Saturday at 4:00 pm, followed by a buffet dinner. Chuck Chidsey made a motion that we move the Memorial Mass to Saturday at 4:00 pm, food and open bar for \$25.00, followed by a St. Gregory Night party to extend into the evening. This would be done only if the rental cost was the same and the food cost would not rise by more than one dollar. This would consolidate the Friday and Sunday events. Jane Watters made a motion to amend the original motion to consider the information and make a final decision on what to do (by the committee). Mike Morrison added that the annual business meeting could be held early on Saturday. There was discussion that since a committee was being organized to coordinate the events, that this committee should make the decisions regarding the cost of these events after they have met. Chuck Chidsey amended his motion to read that we make a suggestion to the Events Committee to combine the St. Gregory Night event and the Memorial Mass and meal into one. The motion carried. The motion to charge \$25 was withdrawn in deference to the Events Committee. Mike Morrison offered his services as DJ for the future St. Gregory Nights.

There was a suggestion from Chuck Chidsey and Mike Morrison that Ward receive a Lifetime Achievement Award for all of his work over the past twenty-six years. There was clear approval from the group.

Ward mentioned that Maggi (Enright) Mastro from the Class of 1943 was the oldest alumni present at the meeting. Maggi is 90-years-young. Congratulations, Maggi!

### Acceptance of the 2013 Minutes

The group was asked to review the minutes of the 2013 Business Meeting which were available in the packet. There were no additions or corrections to the minutes. There was a motion by Tom Bailey and seconded by Mike Morrison to approved the minutes. Motion carried.

### Adjournment

The meeting was adjourned by Ward at 2:25 p.m.

Ward announced that the Alumni Association had made a donation to Joy Academy (Formerly St. Gregory School) in 2013. We are all welcome to stop by and visit our old classrooms.

Following the meeting, the Events Committee met briefly. It was decided that the 2015 event (St. Gregory Day—2015) would be held on August 8, 2015, not the date(s) listed in the Business Meeting packet under Coming Events.

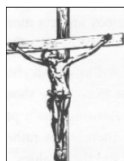

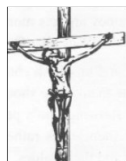
